COLLARD GREEN SALAD W/ PECANS

INGREDIENTS:

SALAD

6 cups finely shredded collards, stem removed 2 tbsp pecan or vegetable oil ½ cup goat cheese, crumbled ½ cup toasted chopped pecans ½ cup Satsuma supremes, skin removed Salt and pepper to taste

SATSUMA VINAIGRETTE

1/4 cup pecan or vegetable oil ½ cup Satsuma juice 2 tbsp cider vinegar Salt and pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS:

Prepare the Salad Base - place the shredded collard greens in a large bowl. Season lightly with salt and pepper, and drizzle with two tablespoons of pecan oil. Toss gently to coat. **Add the toppings** - Sprinkle the goat cheese, toasted pecans and Satsumas over the greens. Make the Dressing - In a small bowl, whisk together ¼ cup pecan oil, Satsuma juice, cider vinegar, and a pinch of salt and pepper until well combined.

Pour the dressing over the salad. Toss gently to evenly distribute the dressing and toppings.

TRI-COUNTY EMC AWARDS 37 BRIGHT IDEAS GRANTS TO LOCAL TEACHERS

In December, Tri-County EMC awarded 37 teachers in Jones, Putnam, Baldwin, and Jasper Counties with education grants totaling \$45,000. Outside judges evaluated applications for innovation, goals, objectives, student involvement, and budget. With the help of Bright Ideas Education Grants, hundreds of students will benefit from hands-on learning experiences brought forth by their teacher's dedication to the education community.



Since 2008, Tri-County EMC has provided more than \$350,000 in grants to local schools. Funded by unclaimed capital credits, the grants help teachers improve education in their classrooms through innovative projects that would otherwise not be funded. Georgia certified public or private school teachers in grades Pre-K through 12th Grade in Baldwin, Jones, Putnam, Jasper, Twiggs, and Wilkinson Counties qualify to apply.
